HISTORY PETE'S CORNER

FDR in WW2

Because of U.S. law and neutrality treaties and encumbered by Isolationists and Pacifists, FDR's hands were tied to be able to do much to stem the growing threat of war from Europe and Japan. Early in the 30's FDR suspected both Germany and Japan were on the warpath.

He began to take steps to curtail them and to get America ready for war. He nationalized the Philippine Army and posted General MacArthur there to make ready a 130,000 man U.S. and Philippine Army. He asked Congress for a two Ocean Navy and for a plan of rapid expansion of our industries to be on the shelf and ready to implement on a moment's notice. Both were granted. He proposed and backed a program known as R.E.A. (Rural Electrification of America). Consisting of a power grid, two huge generating systems. One in the SE known as TVA (Tennessee Valley Authority) and the other in the NW on the Columbia River (the Grand Coolie Dam). For the latter he was ridiculed for building a white elephant in the desert. The ridicule ended when these great systems came online at the outbreak of the war putting America to work building ships and planes and all manner of war materials both for our forces and our allies Britain, Russia, and China. I have been to the Grand Coolie. If you ever get the chance to go do not past it by. It is a monster piece of concrete and engineering.


