HISTORY PETE'S CORNER

Opening Rampage: Coral Sea

In the first week of May 1942, United States reconnaissance planes discovered a two carrier Japanese task force coming South from Rabaul into the Coral Sea to capture Port Moresby on Papua, New Guinea. The Japanese had tried to take Port Moresby by a land route over the Owen Stanley Mountains but were turned back by Australian forces. Now they would try the water approach. Nimitz sent Admiral Fletcher with a two-carrier (Lexington and Yorktown) task force to intercept in a two day running battle; the first of the air battles that would come to dominate the Pacific struggle. Each side lost a carrier making it a draw. Japan, however, claimed a huge victory feeding their already burgeoning, self-imposed victory disease, which would soon cause them to make fatal mistakes. This was strictly an air battle. Big guns were not used to fire on one another.
