A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY

The oldest newsletter in our possession is dated 12/84 Don Bennett Commander. I became Commander in 1987. I'm not sure who edited the newsletter at that time, whether it was Don, myself, or Jim Miller. I do know Russ Hovencamp used a copier kept in the basement of our old Legion to run off newsletters. We had get-to-gathers to address the newsletter to send out through the mail using our Postal Permit #20 to reduce the cost of mailing 1st class. I'm not sure who our typist was, there were several. However, Paula Solat took over in 1989. In May of 1991, my daughter Debbie Gatch took over until Susan McCormick. In about 1993 Vicky Barry took over for several years.

During that period of time the Post Office would no longer accept any self-addressed mailings making it mandatory to have them presorted which only Mailbox, Inc. was able to do. David Updike, owner of Mailbox, Inc., gave us a free ride assuming the costs until he sold the business several years ago. I'm not sure who pays the cost, but I do know our mailing runs about \$90 a month. Not to be overlooked, there were a number of typists during interim

period who took on the job for lesser periods of time. That brings us to Kathi Roach who was our typist for the past seven years. Kathi's family grew and she had added responsibility.

In need of a typist and a reduction in costs, our newsletter needed some changes as we began 2011. First we changed our issue to be once every two months. Next we needed a new typist. In the search of one, I contacted one-half to a dozen people or so who I thought might accept the job, but without much luck. Eating a bowl of chili while getting a Christmas tree at Hunts, my good friend Henry VanNess sat down to munch on a hot dog with son Charlie. Part of our conversation involved my relating the dilemma of our newsletter and not having a typist. One thing led to another and lo & behold our prayers were answered. Henry agreed to help with the tasks of publishing, printing and mailing. At about this time I began a new change in my chemotherapy and was rendered almost useless. Now you know what is behind the story. Please watch for new developments that follow the story.
