"Then good night, peaceful night, till the light if the dawn shineth bright, God is near, do not fear – Friend, good night." Written by General Daniel Bitterfield, with an assist from his bugler, Oliver W. Norton, in 1862. There are no official lyrics to Taps. There are several variations of the lyrics in use today. The above are some of the frequently used.

It was decided to add a bit of explanation regarding Taps and Folding of the American Flag under "Chaplains Corner" this month. For many years now our Post has been able to honor our fallen comrades by conducting a service with full military honors. On January 31st, 15 of our funeral detail met with 3 regular Army Specialists from Bath, NY for the purpose of instruction and certification of the Army's way to properly conduct a military service. We observed and participated in folding of the American Flag for more than two hours. Our chief instructor is called to perform this service about 50 times each month. Since returning from Iraq, this is his assignment for the next year. Our detail provides the color guard, firing squad, bugler, and Chaplain at military funerals. In the event this crew from Bath is not available on a particular day we are now certified to fold the flag as well. It is with honor and dignity that our American Legion Post is able to perform this function when asked to do so for our departed veterans.
