Bill was laid to rest with Military honors provided by the Post 770 Ritual team and member of the US Army.

He served in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division in the Pacific Area and performed ammunition disposition duty during the occupation of Japan. He received an honorable discharge in 1945.
